1. Call to Order.

Mayor Dwain Dungen called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

Mayor Dungen led the Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

3. Consent Agenda.

- a. Approval of Invoices.
- b. Approval of Minutes of December 13, 2012 Regular Meeting.
- c. Approval of Minutes of December 27, 2012 Regular Meeting.
- d. Approval of November 2012 Financial Statements.

Councilman Schonenberg made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Councilman Rankin seconded the motion.

The vote was as follows:

The motion passed.

4. <u>Consideration and Action to Approve Invoices from B&D Graphics.</u>

Councilman Rankin made a motion to approve the invoices from B&D Graphics. Councilman Schonenberg seconded the motion.

5. Citizens' Presentations and Comments.¹

There were no citizens' presentations or comments.

6. <u>City Manager's Report including Sales Tax, Sewer Averaging, TxDOT Sidewalk Project, and</u> <u>Cardinal Hill Elevated Storage Tank Project.</u>

City Manager, Donald Warschak, presented his City Manager's Report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes.

7. Consideration and Action Regarding Presentation from Bus Shield.

Mayor Dungen explained that representatives from Bus Shield had asked to make a presentation to Council. Those representatives were not at the meeting. No action was necessary.

8. <u>Consideration and Action, if Necessary, on the Columbus Volunteer Fire Department Annual</u> <u>Report to Council.</u>

Fire Chief, Walter Glaeser, presented the Columbus Volunteer Fire Department's Annual Report to Council, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. He told Council that landing zones established are included in the motor vehicle accident totals. A discussion followed of the City's insurance rating and what would need to be done to improve it. Ford Stein told Council that the issues in the past have been a need for elevated water supply at fires, the lack of fire inspections, and a lack of water supply. He said that he would look into what would be necessary to increase the City's rating.

No action was necessary.

9. <u>Consideration and Action to Authorize the Submission of an Application for H-GAC Criminal</u> Justice Grant – Juvenile Services.

Mayor Dungen explained that this would be a resubmission of last year's application for the HAND Counseling Center. Joel Usher was present to answer Council questions. He reminded Council that this grant did not require matching funds from the City.

Councilman Schonenberg made a motion to authorize the submission of an application for an H-GAC Criminal Justice Grant for the HAND Counseling Center. Councilman Axel seconded the motion.

10. <u>Consideration and Action to Approve Engagement Letter from Pattillo, Brown & Hill for the September 30, 2012 Audit.</u>

City Secretary, Linda Lakich, explained that Pattillo, Brown & Hill conducted the September 30, 2011 audit for the City and that she was pleased with their work. She said that she would recommend approval of the engagement letter.

12. <u>Consideration and Action to Approve the Publicity and Tourism Agreement between the City of</u> <u>Columbus and the Columbus Chamber of Commerce, Inc.</u>

Mayor Dungen said that the contract was necessary because the Chamber of Commerce runs the Visitors' Center for the City. He also said that the amount to be paid to the Chamber was for administrative costs for the Visitors' Center.

Councilman Rankin made a motion to approve the publicity and tourism agreement between the City and the Columbus Chamber of Commerce, Inc. as presented. Councilman Tesch seconded the motion.

13. Consideration and Action to Approve Schedule for City Council Meetings for February 2013.
