The City Council of the City of Columbus, Texas, met in regular session on Thursday, March 13, 2014 at 6:30 p.m., in the Council Chambers of City Hall located at 605 Spring St., Columbus, Texas, with the following present:

1. Call to Order.

Mayor Dwain Dungen called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. He explained that Councilman Axel was absent due to illness.

2. Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

Mayor Dungen led the Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

3. Consent Agenda.

- a. Approval of Invoices.
- b. Approval of Minutes of February 27, 2014 Regular Meeting.

Councilman Schonenberg made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Councilman Rankin seconded the motion.

The vote was as follows:

The motion passed.

4. Citizens' Presentations and Comments.¹

Chad Henneke from 1321 Milam told Council that he has had a problem with dirty water for some time and that nothing has been done by the City to correct the situation. He said that it looks like rust and that it settles out of the water over time. He asked that something be done about it.

5. City Manager's Report Including Sales Tax, Nesbitt Memorial Library, and Warrant Roundup.

City Manager, Donald Warschak, presented his City Manager's Report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes.

6. <u>Consideration and Action to Approve a Proclamation Declaring March 23 through March 29, 2014</u> <u>as Boys and Girls Club Week in Columbus</u>

Joel Usher invited Council to visit the club during the week to see what they are doing. He said that they would have an open house on March 24th.

Councilman Woodall made a motion to approve the proclamation declaring March 23 through March 29 as Boys and Girls Club Week in Columbus. Councilman Rankin seconded the motion.

7. Certification of Unopposed Candidates in the Regular Municipal Election.

City Secretary, Linda Lakich, certified that the candidates for Council in Places 3, 4, and 5 were unopposed.

8. <u>Consideration and Action to Adopt Ordinance 163-14, an Ordinance of the City of Columbus,</u> <u>Texas, Declaring the Unopposed Candidates for the Offices of City Councilmember Place Three,</u> <u>City Councilmember Place Four, and City Councilmember Place Five as Elected.</u>

Councilman Woodall made a motion to adopt Ordinance 163-14 to declare the unopposed candidates as elected for Councilmember places 3, 4, and 5 as presented. Councilman Schonenberg seconded the motion.

The vote was as follows:

The motion passed.

9. <u>Consideration and Action on the Mayor's Appointment of Two Members to the Employee</u> <u>Grievance Committee for a Term of Two Years.</u>

Mayor Dungen explained that the current members of the Employee Grievance Committee were Councilman Tesch and Councilman Axel who are not able to serve on the committee. He nominated Eddie Hernandez and Steve Woodall to serve on the committee for a two year term. The mayor asked for a vote on the nominations. The vote was as follows:

10. <u>Consideration and Action to Authorize the Mayor to Sign a City Company Agreement with KW</u> International Regarding the Texas Capital Fund Project.

The mayor explained that this would authorize him to sign the agreement between KW International and the City on behalf of the City.

Councilman Schonenberg made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign the City Company Agreement with KW International regarding the Texas Capital Fund Project. Councilman Woodall seconded the motion.
