1. Call to Order.

Mayor Dwain Dungen called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. He asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of Councilman John Axel who died May 28, 2014.

5. <u>City Manager's Report Including Sales Tax, Water Plant Aerator Project, and Downtown Sidewalk</u> Project.

City Manager, Donald Warschak, presented his City Manager's Report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes.

6. <u>Consideration and Action to Authorize Closure of Streets – Milam St. from Walnut to Spring.</u> <u>Spring St. from Milam to Travis, and Travis St. from Spring to Walnut – on July 4, 2014 for the</u> <u>Independence Day Parade and Related Activities.</u>

Nancy Stiles introduced Evan Windham who is the new Visitors Center director. Evan invited the City Officials to participate in the parade on July 4th and to attend the laser show and other activities that evening. She also presented a brief overview of her activity at the Visitors Center, including updating and tracking interest in the Chamber of Commerce/Visitors website.

It was explained that the Chamber would only need to have Spring and Travis Streets closed for the July 4th activities and that they would like the closure starting at 4 p.m. and ending when the event was over around 10 p.m.

Councilman Rankin made a motion to authorize closure of Spring Street and Travis Street adjacent to the Courthouse on July 4th starting at 4 p.m. until no longer needed for Independence Day activities. Councilman Schonenberg seconded the motion.

7. <u>Consideration and Action to Authorize the Application for a Hancher Foundation Grant by the</u> <u>Nesbitt Memorial Library for Scanner and Microfilm Equipment.</u>

He said that the areas which will be affected by the new gas line to the industrial park will be skipped this year and added to next year's seal coat project. This year's seal coating will complete the area north of Walnut and in 2015 the City will begin seal coating on the south side. He said that the City is on a 10 year cycle to completely seal coat all of its streets.

Councilman Schonenberg made a motion to authorize management to advertise for bids for the 2014 Street Seal Coating. Councilman Hernandez seconded the motion.
