1. Call to Order.

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

Dungen led the Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation.

3. Consent Agenda:

- b. Approval of January 2017 Financial Statements

Councilman Swindle made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Councilman Hernandez seconded the motion.

4. Citizens' Presentations and Comments.1

There were no comments.

5. <u>City Manager's Report Including Sales Tax, TxDOT Signal Light Update, IH-10 Colorado River Bridge, Visitors' Center Project, Water System Flushing, and Water Filtration Project.</u>

City Manager, Donald Warschak, gave his report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. Warschak stated the March sales tax payment, which is based on January collections, was \$102,907.70. This was an approximate \$4,000 increase over the same time period last year. He also stated the county and Weimar both saw increases, while Eagle Lake saw a slight decrease. The signal lights at Interstate 10 and Highway 71 are now in flash mode, and should be that way for approximately a week.

Warschak stated TxDOT would be doing repairs to the west bound lanes of the IH-10 river bridge. The repairs should be completed by Friday. The City should expect increased traffic due to travelers avoiding the slow down on the interstate.

Regarding the Visitors' Center, he stated advertising for bids would be ongoing for a month, with bids being accepted on April 21st.

Warschak stated City crews are currently flushing the water system in the Northeast quadrant of the City.

He concluded his report by stating the plans for the Water Filtration Project were almost complete.

Councilman Rankin asked about reimbursement for the repairs at the waste water treatment plant. The Mayor suggested sending an amended project cost plan to FEMA since more material was required for the repairs due to additional bank erosion.

Councilman Swindle asked about the property north of the sewer plant, and if the erosion was going to be addressed. Warschak stated the Corps of Engineers would be looking at that property.

6. <u>Consideration and Action to Declare a 2009 Ford Crown Victoria Police Patrol Unit, VIN 2FAHP71V39X110594, as Surplus Property.</u>

Warschak stated this vehicle had been replaced with a new Tahoe, and could now be sent to auction.

Councilman Rankin made a motion to declare the specified police vehicle as surplus property. Councilman Cummings seconded the motion.

The vote was as follows:

The motion passed.

7. <u>Consideration and Action, if Necessary, Regarding the February 2017 Columbus Golf Association Report.</u>

CMGA treasurer, Mike Craddock, gave the report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. Craddock stated they had been receiving some membership dues. He also said March was looking good for business due to the good weather. Councilman Rankin asked about details on memberships, and their plans to increase membership numbers. Councilman Swindle also stated membership had to be increased.

Craddock told Council this would be the last report he would deliver. John Mangini will be the new treasurer. The Mayor thanked Craddock for his service to the CMGA.

Councilman Cummings – Asked if the swings at Midtown Park would be replaced, and he also stated there was a fence down near the bridge where the gas comes in. Warschak stated he would inquire about the swings, and the downed fence did not pose a safety hazard.
