He said that there is a business which makes oil field vessels that is interested in locating a facility at the Industrial Park, but since they are fabricators they are subject to Planning & Zoning review. Columbus Community & Industrial Development Corporation (CCIDC) board president, Lori An Gobert that the restrictions were placed in the ordinance to prevent unwanted industries from locating in the city. She said that CCIDC has met with representatives of this company and that the CCIDC board is in favor of having them locate in the Industrial Park. They are currently located in Houston and have outgrown their facility. If they move to Columbus, the City will get additional sales tax and 40 new jobs. She also said that the CCIDC's Architectural Control Committee will enforce requirements for aesthetics. Mary Ellen Prause asked if anyone had visited their Houston facility. Lori An Gobert said that someone had and that it was very well run. She also said that they will try to use local vendors for construction and services. Donald Warschak showed the commission a preliminary plan for the company's development at the park.
