4. Citizens' Presentations and Comments¹

City Manager, Donald Warschak, gave his report. A copy is attached to these minutes.

Regarding the MLK Street Sidewalk Project, Warschak reported the ADA inspection has been completed, and we are just waiting for TxDOT for project closeout.

Warschak stated the new East River Bridge would be opening soon, possibly in December; there is no update on the Highway 90 signal light project; the Highway 90 sidewalk project has been bid, but no start date has been confirmed.

TxDOT will begin the application process in December for the Transportation Alternatives Grant Program. The City will apply again for Montezuma Street.

In conclusion, Warschak stated the sewer averaging period for residential customers will begin on December 15th and run thru February 15th. Water used during this time will be used to calculate residential sewer rates for the upcoming year.

Councilman Ridlen asked about street sign replacement and/or cleaning. Warschak stated they are scheduling the inventory of signs and cleaning with the new pressure washer.

Councilman Rankin asked about the abandoned AEP utility poles, and if there was a remedy. Warschak stated he would check with our AEP rep.
